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Kalgoorlie-Boulder strikes gold with Altus Financials



The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder is a large local government servicing over 30,000 people in the Goldfields-Esperance region of Western Australia.

The City needed a comprehensive financial management and accounting system to modernise their current processes. Being a longstanding IT Vision customer and SynergySoft user, the City partnered with IT Vision in late 2021 to become an Early Adopter partner for Altus Financials, with go live expected late this year.

As IT Vision's largest product offering, Altus Financials is a comprehensive portfolio of financial tools delivered through a simple, highly engaging user interface. It is a cloud-based management system that translates older processes that were previously manual and paper-based and systemises them into a product that is easily accessible anywhere and at any time. The system is built with high levels of cybersecurity, business continuity, audit control, organisational governance, and workflow to ensure a seamless user experience.

"Altus Financials was developed in collaboration with real users based on real experiences, so we could ensure it met the ongoing needs of our current and prospective clients," said Product Manager Eliza Sbizzirri. "We see Altus as a constant work in progress. As our clients' businesses evolve, so do we."

The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder is the second local government to adopt Altus Financials, after the Shire of Gingin went live in October 2020. As an early adopter, the Shire of Gingin played an active role in shaping the product and ensuring it was fit for purpose. Now, Altus Financials is being tested by a significantly larger local government authority in the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

The IT Vision team have made regular visits to Kalgoorlie to work with City employees, understand their internal processes and made key modifications to the product based on the City's needs.

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The IT Vision team communicates often with us, and we hold regular meetings to bring up issues and have them resolved in a collaborative manner.

The project is ongoing with phases of the implementation in progress, with completion expected in November 2022.





Shire of Plantagenet Upgrades to a Full ERP System



Located north of Denmark and Albany, the Shire of Plantagenet is situated in the Great Southern region of Western Australia and is managed from the town of Mount Barker. They began the internal process of re-examining their IT systems last year, identifying issues and backlogs in their processes stemming from a need of modernisation.

The Shire had been a customer of IT Vision's since 2004, having used SynergySoft Records. When assessing their IT needs for a comprehensive ERP system, many factors went into the decision making that led to the final selection of IT Vision.



All of the councils surrounding our area were on SynergySoft and Altus and we couldn't consider joint resource sharing without compatibility across IT systems.

"There was so much to back up our decision in choosing IT Vision, including their significant local presence as a WA company. Their good reputation, customer service and support, and their user group were all factored in."

The process from the moment IT Vision came on board to completion of implementation took 9 months, with the project administered in phases. Weekly virtual meetings were held between the Shire and IT Vision teams throughout the project and subject matter experts were dispatched to the Shire in each relevant phase of the project to provide support and ensure a smooth implementation. The full ERP system went live on July 1, 2021.

"The support from the IT Vision staff during the project was

incredible," says John. "The support after launch has been excellent and ongoing for any issues that come up."

Since the go-live last year, Shire staff have reported a noticeable relief on time and resources. Altus Payroll has replaced manual timesheets with a system that allows staff to complete timesheets on their laptops or mobile phones and receive real-time information for leave and payslips. Manual calculations and processes that previously took weeks for staff to complete now run through the system, saving countless hours and lessening margins of error.



The audit season is another area benefitting from the upgraded system. The Shire's previous system was unable to create the reports auditors needed, creating more tasks and time taken for Shire staff to compile reports themselves. The upgraded system creates exactly what the auditors need, saving time and effort on both sides.

"From a general ledger point of view, we've now got a consistent and compliant chart of accounts and the process of preparing financial statements is more robust," says John. "The procurement system is all online so people can do their purchasing orders with much more control built into the system to ensure purchasing policies are adhered to

We can't really fault anything. Everything is more efficient."

IT Vision has an exciting new product that is in the early stages of being introduced to our customers: Altus Budgeting.

Altus Budgeting builds upon our range of cloud-based Altus products, with tight integration to Altus Financials. Developed with local governments in mind, Altus Budgeting empowers organisations to consolidate and maintain the quality of budget data presently and into the future. Through systemisation of the budget workflow, what is often a long and difficult process is now managed with accuracy and efficiency.

The development of Altus Budgeting was inspired by working alongside our users to better understand what the typical budget preparation process looks like – who is involved, what parts are time consuming and what are the pain points? We quickly identified a major source of frustration and inefficiency was the collection of submissions from many sources and consolidating into a single view. Was anything missing? Has the appropriate Manager reviewed it? What if changes need to be made? These are the kinds of challenges Altus Budgeting aims to resolve.

"We expect Altus Budgeting will deliver huge accuracy and efficiency gains for our customers, particularly those who have a very manual budget preparation process currently," says Mark Burbridge, Product Owner.

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We hope the days of Council Accountants staring at manual spreadsheets into the early hours of the morning are over!

"The first release of Altus Budgeting is now being rolled out to early adopters to gain feedback and help refine the product. Initial features include a systemised workflow to prepare, submit and approve budgets, tools to import and export the data for analysis, and integration to load the result into the accounting system. Paired with the same user interface as Altus Financials, Altus Budgeting allows many contributors to participate and collaborate in the budget preparation process — eliminating manual collection and consolidation of data.






Chart of Accounts Program Gains Momentum

The Standard Chart of Accounts (Standard Chart) program aims to create consistency across Local Government financial systems to make it easier to share reports, documentation, and knowledge across the sector.

The Standard Chart was an initiative launched and led by the IT Vision User Group, with experienced IT Vision consultants brought on board to implement and execute the program in partnership with Local Government Professionals WA.

The Standard Chart includes the creation of a standardised numbering system in SynergySoft for general ledgers, jobs, cost centres, element types and more. It also ensures all accounting standards are met, including those imposed from state and federal departments.

Local Government Professionals WA, IT Vision, the IT Vision User Group and a representative from the Office of the Auditor General, came together in March 2022 to discuss the status of the project, to knowledge share and provide feedback on the process so far.

Rhona Hawkins, IT Vision User Group member and LG Best Practices consultant, said the Standard Chart continues to grow in complexity and strength as more local governments come on board.

"Local governments are all bound by the same reporting requirements so if you're completing a tedious task or hitting a roadblock, you can bet there's others out there struggling, too," said Rhona.

"The standard COA is all about sharing resources and knowledge to get the best outcome for the sector across the board."

Product Manager at IT Vision, Eliza Sbizzirri, said 19 of IT Vision's customers have already adopted the Standard Chart. The Shires of Quairading, Mount Magnet, Ravensthorpe, Capel, Yalgoo, Wickepin, and Nannup are currently embarking on their journey this financial year and are aiming to go live with the Standard Chart by 30 June.

"Adopting the Standard Chart is just step one. Following this, we work with our customers to undertake an annual review, to ensure the ongoing integrity is maintained and they feel supported long term."



A Look Back at Our Longest Serving Local Government Clients







For more than 30 years, IT Vision has been building relationships with clients from several industries, a key sector of which is local government across Western Australia. Information technology has changed significantly over the decades and the depth of the relationships developed through innovation and collaboration is nothing short of remarkable.

Working with local governments aligns with our corporate vision of enhancing the productivity and service quality of those that serve the communities in which we live. We wanted to highlight the enduring relationships with a few of our local government clients as a token of our appreciation for the years we have worked together, taking a walk down memory lane with insights and recollections from IT Vision's founders Alan Smith and Earl Ward.

Alan and Earl's work with local government began with the then-Shire of Busselton, now City of Busselton, and the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River in 1984. The relationship with these shires is especially notable in that it established the groundwork for what would become IT Vision, launched as Vision Computer Systems in 1991.

"Back in 1984, the shires were working together to champion a brand-new local government software package that was going to change the Australian local government applications software scene," said Earl.

The software manufacturing venture and the Shire's locations coincided to develop the winegrowing culture and tourism industries in the southwest of Western Australia. Earl attributes the success of IT Vision's past and current products to the progressive vision of the Shire staff in those early days. "Administrator, then SynergySoft, and now Altus in part owe their existence to those adventurous and innovative people who invested their efforts to champion and implement new systems."

Another early innovator in the IT Vision history is the Shire of Katanning. As with the staff at the City of Busselton and

Shire of Augusta-Margaret River, Katanning's staff were forward thinkers who saw a future in digitisation.

"They enthusiastically helped us identify improvements to our software, were willing to try out new features, and showed other councils how they best deployed the software."

Alan recalls the years working with Augusta-Margaret River and Busselton as the start of a "wonderful journey" with ties that have stood the test of time. "Both of these shires highlight the nature of local government which I've always looked upon as a tight knit community where people mix, communicate, and share," he says. "Working within the local government community means that relationships are built and last for many years."



After 18 months of preparation, IT Vision was proud to achieve ISO-27001 Certification in late December 2021.

ISO-27001 is an international standard on how to manage information security. It offers an organised approach on how to maintain confidentiality, integrity, and availability of information systems in an organisation. It includes policies, procedures, processes, and systems that work to manage information security risks.

An external and independent auditor examined all aspects of IT Vision's business processes and recommended the business for certification and, in December 2021, we received our ISO-27001 certification.

As an ISO-27001 certified organisation, IT Vision's people, processes, tools, and systems all adhere to the internationally recognised framework.



While achieving this information security standard required active involvement from all IT Vision staff members, there was a dedicated project team who worked around the clock to ensure all systems and processes were where they needed to be. This was lead by Chief Technology Officer, Adrian Halid, Guy Brown (Business Services Manager) and Sourabh Sharma (Security Officer).

Governance and Compliance Officer, Amanda Murray, has since joined the IT Vision team to take charge in managing the ongoing obligations and responsibilities of retaining ISO-27001 compliance.
